10:00 am– Worship Service

### WHAT TO EXPECT

- ◆ **We are asking you to wear face coverings.** *All employees, members and visitors in attendance shall wear face coverings before, during and after the service, whether indoors or outdoors. Please, continue to wear face coverings to sing – it must stay on for the duration of the service.*
- ◆ **The double doors in the lower lot will be our only access point.**
- ◆ **There will be no sharing of the peace before service or receiving line after church to maximize social distancing.**
- ◆ **Please do not attend church or other church activities if you have a respiratory illness or feel like they are coming down with one for at least 14 days after your full recovery.** Family members should not attend either.
- ◆ **If you are high risk, consider not attending service.** We will continue to stream our worship services for those who cannot attend.
- ◆ **Offering collection: We will not be passing the collection plate during the offertory.** Please either drop your offering in the collection plates by the door or give online. Alternatively, you may mail a check to the church office.
- ◆ **Communion will be coming in prepackaged hosts and cups, of both wine and grape juice. We are planning on having communion only 2 times a month (1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays.)** Pastor will consecrate the communion elements during the service and we will commune together in the service at the designated time for communion. There will be a receptacle at the door for disposing the supplies upon leaving the sanctuary.
- ◆ **There will be an elder who will be writing down those attending service.** If an outbreak occurs, this information will allow us to have a way to contact individuals that may have been exposed which may be critical to help save lives.

## ZOOM BIBLE STUDY QUESTIONS

### Think on These Things

As a group, take turns naming one situation or circumstance that brings you worry. Let's have one person record them so we can pray over them at the end.

Looking at verse 6, do you believe it is possible not to worry about anything? What is Paul's antidote or remedy for worry?

Often, we worry about things outside our control. How can prayer be an answer to our excessive worry? When we worry, how are we trying to control things we can't control?

Going back to verse 4, Paul also encourages us to rejoice. What's the difference between happiness and joy? In what ways have you found yourselves rejoicing lately?

Moving into verse 5, Paul also advocates that we treat one another with gentleness. How can that be a form of ministry and witnessing to our faith during this time when anxiety seems more pronounced? How does treating others with gentleness begin from a place of joy?

Thinking about verses 8-9 what practices, habits, or routines can help us "think on these things" of verse 8?

Let's pray over the list of worries now.
