

CALL TO WORSHIP & INVOCATION

P: Friends, the tomb is empty! The stone has been rolled away!

C: Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed!

P: For three days he lay in that cold and lonely cave.

C: But God’s love cannot be contained by anything, not even death!

P: Thanks be to God, who gives us victory throughout our Risen Lord.

C: Death has been swallowed up in victory!

P: Where, O death, is your victory?

C: Where, O death, is your sting?

P: Christ is risen!

C: He is risen, indeed!

P: Come, let us worship the Risen Christ, His Father and + Holy Spirit! Amen!

ORDER OF CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS

P: O Living God,

C: We confess that at times we do not share in the joy of the resurrection because we are caught in the worries of the world. We confess that we do not always live in the Spirit of new life but remain discontent, grumbling and anxious. Forgive us for forgetting there is still road work ahead, and not sharing in the Good News. Forgive us when we find it more comfortable to worry and complain than to risk the joy and encouragement of new life in Christ. Call us back to Your ways, O God, to seek hope and reconciliation, restoration and peace. In the name of the Risen Christ, we pray. Amen.

(Silence for reflection and self-examination)

P: Christ is Risen! The stone is rolled away, the tomb found empty. Mary calls out, "I have seen the Lord!" We have seen Christ, too, in every helping hand, in every heartfelt gift, in every choice to restore life in this world. We are called to this new life, a life of forgiveness and reconciliation. You are forgiven all your sins in the name of the Father, Son, and + Holy Spirit; accept your forgiveness and know that God loves you and desires great joy for your life.

C: Amen!

Bible Study Questions for Zoom Bible Study– Wed. at 7 PM

Matthew 28:1-10

Why did Mary Magdalene & the other Mary “(go) to see the tomb” early in the morning? What were they expecting to see? What emotions do you think they were feeling as they walked? How would you have felt if you were with them?

Why do you think the angel told the women not to be afraid ? What reason does the angel give the women for not being afraid (“Do not be afraid for . . .)? What evidence does the angel give to the women to prove his claim that Jesus has risen? Why is this evidence important?

The angel said that Jesus had risen “just as He said.” According to Matthew’s gospel, what had Jesus said to the disciples concerning His death (see 16:21; 17:22-23; 20:17-19; and cf. 12:40)? Do you think the disciples should have expected the crucifixion and empty tomb? Would you have expected these events or would you be sharing the same confused emotions as the women at the tomb?

What is the road work ahead that both the angel and Jesus call the women to? Would this have been a difficult task you think? Do we ourselves have a message like this to deliver?

In v8, the women are said to have great fear, and great joy. Why would they have fear, do we think? Why joy, do we think? These two emotions come before the women meet Jesus in v9. Their first response is to take hold of his feet and worship him. If we thought about this scene as a model for worship, what would it teach us about worship? How does it compare to our own worship?

Explain the contention that the Christian faith stands or falls based on Christ's resurrection. Explain the connection between Jesus' resurrection and your own salvation. As we work on these explanations, how do they reflect the road work ahead we are still called to do? How can we take heart that our labor is not in vain, as Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 15:58?
