WHAT'S HAPPENING TODAY?

Thanks for streaming with us today on Trinity Sunday! In our Gospel text we see Jesus command the disciples go out: “Baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit” (v. 19). He invokes the name of the Triune God he one of, but the bulk of the passage isn’t about God; it’s about us. It’s about what we will do in the name of God. It’s about what we’ll do because we belong to Jesus. So this morning we will open our eyes and see how we can go therefore and serve the Triune God and our neighbors with love and care.

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

Matthew 28:16-20

How many disciples went to Galilee? Why might that be significant?

Where do the eleven disciples meet the risen Christ? How did they know to meet him there? Why is listening crucial when it comes to the Great Commission?

Why might it be significant that some of the disciples “worshiped” and some doubted (v. 17)?

Why is it crucial to recognize and believe in the authority of Christ as we seek to obey the Great Commission?

The risen Christ notes his authority and then gives a fourfold instruction: go, make disciples, baptize, and teach. Take time this week to deliberate about the meanings of each word and how we as a church can accomplish each of these.

What might obedience to the Great Commission look like for a stay-at-home mom? How about a homebound member of your church? What about a student? How can each of us go therefore?
