WHAT TO EXPECT

- ◆ **We are asking you to wear face coverings.** *All employees, members and visitors in attendance shall wear face coverings before, during and after the service, whether indoors or outdoors. Please, continue to wear face coverings to sing – it must stay on for the duration of the service.*
- ◆ **The double doors in the lower lot will be our only access point.**
- ◆ **There will be no sharing of the peace before service or receiving line after church to maximize social distancing.**
- ◆ **We will not be having fellowship time or Bible Study between services, so we can focus on cleaning the sanctuary between services.**
- ◆ **Please do not attend church or other church activities if you have a respiratory illness or feel like they are coming down with one for at least 14 days after your full recovery.** Family members should not attend either.
- ◆ **If you are high risk, consider not attending service.** We will continue to stream our worship services for those who cannot attend.
- ◆ **Offering collection: We will not be passing the collection plate during the offertory.** Please either drop your offering in the collection plates by the door or give online. Alternatively, you may mail a check to the church office.
- ◆ **Communion will be coming in prepackaged hosts and cups, of both wine and grape juice. We are planning on having communion only 2 times a month (1st and 3rd Sundays.)** Pastor will consecrate the communion elements during the service and we will commune together in the service at the designated time for communion. There will be a receptacle at the door for disposing the supplies upon leaving the sanctuary.
- ◆ **There will be an elder who will be writing down those attending service.** If an outbreak occurs, this information will allow us to have a way to contact individuals that may have been exposed which may be critical to help save lives.

APOSTLES' CREED—2ND ARTICLE

C: And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

ZOOM BIBLE STUDY QUESTIONS

In Jesus Christ, His Son, Our Lord

What does the name Jesus Christ mean to you? How is he the anointed one?

Read Romans 1:1-4. What does Paul write here that shows both Jesus' humanity and his divinity? Why must we confess Jesus as fully human and fully divine?

Read John 3:16. What does it mean that Jesus is the Father's, "only begotten Son?" How does his sonship impact our beliefs?

Read Romans 10:1-4. Even as believers in Jesus, we are still prone to think we have to earn our righteousness and have faith in Christ. While our lives should reflect our faith, our actions do not earn us anything. What are some of the things you feel you have to do (or avoid) in order for God to still accept you?

Look at Romans 10:9-10. What is the Creed in this passage? What are opportunities we have to confess, "Jesus as Lord?" What does it mean when we confess that he is, "Our Lord?"

What does Paul mean "if you believe in your heart?" Why is it so critical to believe that God raised Jesus from the dead? How are we justified?

Read Romans 10:12-13. Why does Paul mention God "bestowing his riches on all who call on him?" What are these riches? What does it mean to "call on the name of the Lord" so that a person can be saved?

How can you live under the Lordship of Jesus this week in a way that brings glory to him and is a witness to others?
