10:00 am– Worship Service

WHAT TO EXPECT

- ◆ **We are asking you to wear face coverings.** All employees, members and visitors in attendance are asked to wear face coverings before, during and after the service.
- ◆ **The double doors in the lower lot will be our only access point.**
- ◆ **There will be no sharing of the peace before service or receiving line after church to maximize social distancing.**
- ◆ **We will not be having fellowship time or Bible Study after service, to minimize risk and to clean the sanctuary after service.** Please join us on Wednesdays though for Zoom Bible Study at 10 am or 7 pm!
- ◆ **Please do not attend church or other church activities if you have a respiratory illness or feel like they are coming down with one for at least 14 days after your full recovery.** Family members should not attend either.
- ◆ **If you are high risk, consider not attending service.** We will continue to stream our worship services for those who cannot attend.
- ◆ **Offering collection: We will not be passing the collection plate during the offertory.** Please either drop your offering in the collection plates by the door or give online. Alternatively, you may mail a check to the church office.
- ◆ **Communion will be coming in prepackaged hosts and cups, of both wine and grape juice. We are planning on having communion only 2 times a month (1st and 3rd Sundays.)** Pastor will consecrate the communion elements during the service and we will commune together in the service at the designated time for communion. There will be a receptacle at the door for disposing the supplies upon leaving the sanctuary.
- ◆ **There will be an elder checking people in for service.** If an outbreak occurs, this information will allow us to have a way to contact individuals that may have been exposed which may be critical to help save lives.
- ◆ **When you pick up your service elements we will have a recommended temperature check.**
- ◆ **Remember to layer up as the windows will be open and the fans will be on to help with air circulation.**

Follow Me a Second Time—Jonah 3:1-5, 10

PRAYERS & PRAISES

Praise God:

- **We thank you are a good of second chances!** Thank you that your words of forgiveness and life come to us time and time again! May your words of grace and mercy wash over us in the midst of the storms and bring us up from the depths. Give us the power to bring change and transformation to the peoples of the world as did those early fishermen. BIBLE STUDY QUESTIONS Follow Me A Second Time

Read Jonah 1:1-5 . What is important about the word of the Lord coming to Jonah? What action is God calling him to? Has the word of the Lord come to us? What action is he calling us to?

What is Jonah's response to the call? What direction does he continue to go? Where are examples of this? What does this illustrate to us when we go against God's call?

Read Jonah 3:1-10. Looking at verse 1, what does it say about God that he would give Jonah a second chance? How does God give us second chances? What does Jonah do with his second chance? What should we do with ours?

What does Jonah's sermon in verse 4 say about him? How will God overturn or change Nineveh? Will God overturn our change our lands as well? How do we play a part in this with the mulligan of God's grace we have been given?

What is the significance of everyone from the king all the way down to the lowest of the people, and even the animals partaking in the about face? Why is actually giving up their evil ways and violence an important part of this repentance? How should this inform our repentance?
