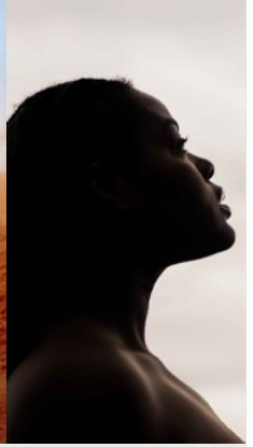
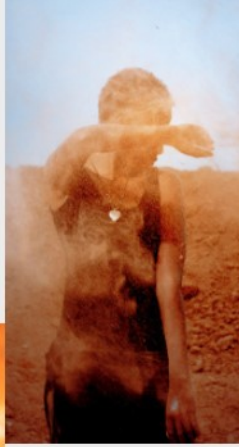

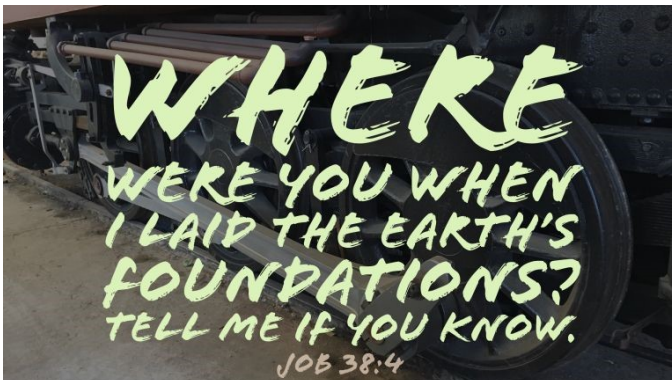


The flowers this morning are given by Melina Mantey in celebration of the life of her grandma Sue Lambuth.



WHAT TO EXPECT

- ◆ **Masks are required even for fully vaccinated people.**

Wednesday Zoom Bible Study

Out of the Whirlwind-Job 38:1-15, 34-41

Has there been a time in your life when God answered you in a loud or obvious way?

Read Job 38:1-15. Looking at verse 1, what is significant about God coming out of a whirlwind? How do you think Job was feeling that after all of these conversations God finally answered him?

Looking at verses 2-3, God tells Job that he speaks words without knowledge. Why is this a good reminder for us in our times of questioning God?

As we move on in this section what types of questions does God use to question Job? How is this method not only impactful for Job, but for us? How might this speech give a new vision of God and of relating to God, who loves us completely? How might we use this type of language to point to God in our lives?

Looking at verses 4-7, how is it that God describes creation? How is this an important reminder for us today? How might this impact the way we care for creation?

After reading all of this how should we respond to these questions? In other words, what takeaways do we have?

Stewardship Thoughts—Job 38

In the beloved classic books, The Chronicles of Narnia, one of C. S. Lewis’s characters, Mr. Beaver, offers a profoundly insightful picture of Christ, portrayed in the books as Aslan the Lion. Mr. Beaver says, “One day you’ll see him [Aslan] and another you won’t. He doesn’t like being tied down—and of course he has other countries to attend to. It’s quite all right. He’ll drop in. Only you mustn’t press him. He’s wild, you know. Not like a tame lion.” Not like a tame lion. That’s what Job must now learn. God doesn’t govern His universe as Job, or anyone, else thinks He should, but according to His unsearchable wisdom. God isn’t “tame”—He speaks to Job out of the storm—but He is perfectly good and completely loving.
