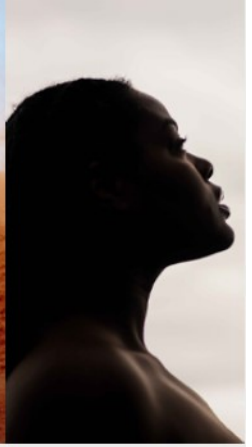
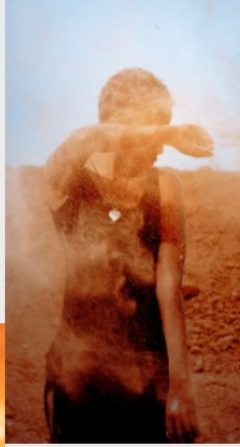

WHAT TO EXPECT

- ◆ **Masks are required even for fully vaccinated people.**
- ◆ **There will be no sharing of the peace before service or receiving line after church to maximize social distancing.**
- ◆ **Please do not attend church or other church activities if you have a respiratory illness or feel like you are coming down with one for at least 14 days after your full recovery.** Family members should not attend either.
- ◆ **Offering collection: We will not be passing the collection plate during the offertory.** Please either drop your offering in the collection plates by the door or give online. Alternatively, you may mail a check to the church office.
- ◆ **Communion will be coming in prepackaged hosts and cups, of both wine and grape juice. We are planning on having communion only 2 times a month (1st and 3rd Sundays.)** Pastor will consecrate the communion elements during the service and we will commune together in the service at the designated time for communion. There will be a receptacle at the door for disposing the supplies upon leaving the sanctuary.
- ◆ **We will no longer be doing a temperature check at church, but do ask you to self monitor your temperature at home before coming to church.**

ORDER OF CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS

P: Loving and merciful Father,

C: When overcome by grief, with Job we wonder what happened to Your love and Your wonderful plan for our lives? It feels as though our prayers fall on deaf ears. Like Job, we begin looking for You to the east, to the west, to the north and the south—all the four points of the horizon and the compass—but You are nowhere to be found. The darkness threatens to swallow us whole and we feel as though we are drowning in the ocean of divine silence. Lord, then we are tempted to do something cheap or dirty, or something that will bring great shame upon us and those we love. Have mercy on us and forgive us, O God for those times we sin.

(Silence for reflection and self-examination)

P: Hear the word of the LORD from Job 42:12, “The LORD blessed the latter part of Job’s life more than the first.” Our God turns crucifixions into resurrections. What was dead is now alive and what was once defeat is now an everlasting triumph. Christ is alive. He forgives you all your sins, in the name of the Father, Son, + and Holy Spirit!

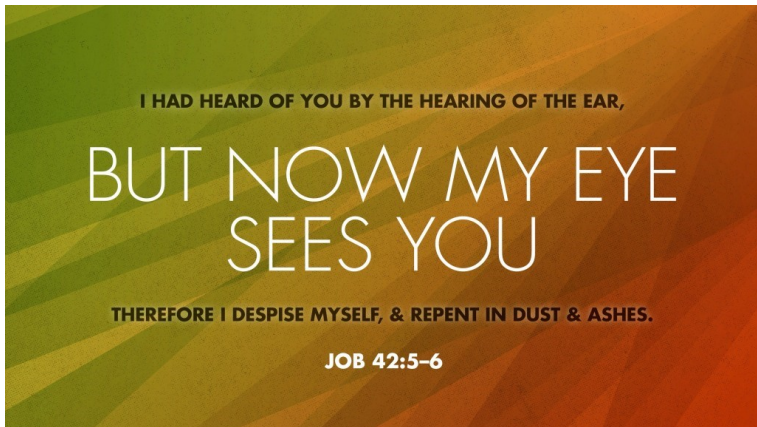

SERMON NOTES

Now My Eyes See—Job 42:1-6, 10-17

PRAYERS & PRAISES

Praise God:

- **God of life, You open our eyes on the world you love and show us your presence and purpose all around us.** We see the beauty and wonder of your creation in autumn changes, and in gifts of love and compassion offered through friend and stranger. For these many gifts, we give you thanks. And we pray, as you open our eyes to your love day by day, we might share this same love and open other people's eyes to your love.
- **We give praise for this day and everyday that they may be holy, good and joyful.** That we may offer to you our worship and our work, and that we may strive for the well-being of all creation. And that in the pleasures and pains of life, we may know the love of Christ and be thankful.
- **Thank you for the brave, wise, and good among us who risk so much to protect life, health, liberty, and justice.** Renew and sustain their strength and resolve. Use them to mend communities fractured by sickness, violence, and injustice, and to lead many along your way.
- **Bless your church, that she may shine with your Son's light in this world.** Revive and refresh us by your Holy Spirit so that we can confess your name before others, pray fervently for our neighbor, and demonstrate your love through good works.

In Our Prayers:

- **We pray for those who cannot recognize and see the gifts of your Gospel gifts in their lives and find themselves lost and alone.** Open their eyes to your presence through our companionship and our eyes for opportunities to reach out with understanding.
- **God of justice, You open our eyes on the world and show us struggle and conflict.** We see the stressful times in which we live and the burdens many are carrying; Today, we pray for those whose businesses are still struggling as the pandemic stretches on; For producers unsure their harvests will be sufficient this season; For workers uncertain about their jobs or looking for new work; And for families carrying the stress of economic uncertainty we pray your blessings of security and peace upon them.
- **God of wisdom, You open our eyes on the world and show us its complexities.** We see countries locked in old animosities and communities overwhelmed by anger and upheaval. We pray for the millions displaced by current conflicts and natural disasters and for leaders everywhere, trying to find solutions to complex problems. Open the eyes of those who lead to recognize the suffering among their peoples, and open our eyes to ways we can participate in solutions.
- **We ask that Jesus would bring healing and encouragement to all who suffer in body, mind, or spirit.** Bring them healing and hope, light and life. Refresh all who care for them, so together they may walk along your way.

Zoom Bible Study Questions

Now My Eyes See

Read Job 42:1-6,10-17. Looking at verse 3 what is significant to Job admitting to the Lord that there are things of God too wonderful for him to understand? How might this impact us?

Going on and focusing on verse 5, what changes as Job goes from hearing the Lord to seeing him with his eyes? What does this seeing the Lord bring about in verse 6?

Read James 5:11. Having just gone through this series how do you better understand the steadfastness of Job? How does he persevere in spiritual warfare? What reminder is this for us? Finally, how does Job 42 show that God responds with compassion and mercy?

Looking at verses 10-17, is this just Job getting things back or is it more than that? How might we look at this as an example of grace fulfilled in Jesus Christ?

Thinking about Job, why is this part of his life just not a “happy ever after?” How can this remind us how to treat others who are blessed in the things of the world?

Read Job 19:25-27. What impacts you about this statement of faith in the midst of trials? How does Job foreshadow what is to come in Job 42? How do his eyes truly see the Lord? How can this encourage us going forward?

Welcome to RLC as this morning we conclude our series in Job, “Born to Trouble.”

Job 42 is where we see the conclusion to Job’s narrative. What will we see? Is it happy ever after? Not exactly, this is an Advent-like moment to embrace the now and the not yet in tension or in coexistence. We celebrate new life and new hope, even as we grieve death and loss. For we must continue to stand in solidarity with those who are hurting. Because those who have come through a time of trial still bear the scars and ought not be dismissed as a happily ever after ending.
