WHAT TO EXPECT

- ◆ **Masks are required even for fully vaccinated people.**

There will be a receptacle at the door for disposing the supplies upon leaving the sanctuary.
- ◆ **We will no longer be doing a temperature check at church, but do ask you to self monitor your temperature at home before coming to church.**



Zoom Bible Study Questions

To and Fro on the Earth

Read Job 1:1. What is Job described as in this passage? How are each of these characteristics important as the narrative continues?

Read Job 1:2-5. What is in this passage that reminds us about how terrible things can happen to people no matter what their status is in life? What is the reminder here about the only thing we can truly rely on as Christians?

Looking at both Job 1:8 and Job 2:3. Why does God offer Job over to the Satan as the one to afflict? Why is it important for us to note that God repeats what the author of Job says in 1:1?

Read Job 1:12 and 2:6 What does this story suggest about God's power that "the Satan" can act only on the permission of God?

In chapter 1 we see all of Job's external treasures of life, except for his wife taken. In Job 2, we see he is impacted in his body. How would have all of this impacted him mentally and spiritually? How might this inform us as we respond to people who are deeply grieving?

Have you ever thought as Job and his life in terms of him being a prophet and that his suffering is pointing to the Christ? How might this idea change the way you see this book?

Welcome to RLC as this morning we begin our series in Job, “Born to Trouble.”

In this series we will see the human condition seems rife with difficulty from birth to death. We are, as “Comforter” Eliphaz declares, in a rare moment of clarity, born to trouble as the sparks fly upward (Job 5:7). So, what word can we bring to those who know the depth of this experience? Stewardship Thought-Job 2:1-10

After Job’s second round of adversity—when he became infected with terrible boils—his wife offered him some troubling advice. This is may be the worst advice in a book full of questionable wisdom from others. Yes, this was terrible advice, but she deserves grace from us. We cannot forget that Job was not alone in his losses—she experienced them too. Here was a mother who had just lost all of her children. She was grieving too. She was struggling too. She was in pain too. Sometimes, in our pain, we develop shortsightedness. Our suffering is so great, we turn our attention inward and forget that others around us might be hurting as well. The gospel pushes us to resist this. Jesus humbled Himself and suffered greatly all the while fixing His gaze on the Father’s glory and our good. For that reason, we should also strive to live selflessly always, even when were are hurting.
