### WHAT TO EXPECT

- ◆ **Masks are optional for fully vaccinated people.** If you are not fully vaccinated we ask that you still wear your mask in accordance with local and national guidelines.
- ◆ **The double doors in the lower lot will be our only access point.**
- ◆ **There will be no sharing of the peace before service or receiving line after church to maximize social distancing.**
- ◆ **Please do not attend church or other church activities if you have a respiratory illness or feel like you are coming down with one for at least 14 days after your full recovery.** Family members should not attend either.
- ◆ **Offering collection: We will not be passing the collection plate during the offertory.** Please either drop your offering in the collection plates by the door or give online. Alternatively, you may mail a check to the church office.
- ◆ **Communion will be coming in prepackaged hosts and cups, of both wine and grape juice. We are planning on having communion only 2 times a month (1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays.)** Pastor will consecrate the communion elements during the service and we will commune together in the service at the designated time for communion. There will be a receptacle at the door for disposing the supplies upon leaving the sanctuary.
- ◆ **We will no longer be doing a temperature check at church, but do ask you to self monitor your temperature at home before coming to church.**

# PRAYERS & PRAISES

## Praise God:

- **We praise you for being our peace and in that peace breaking down the walls of division and hostility.** With those walls broken down, give us the strength to build bridges in your peace. Give us the grace to not rebuild those walls. Let us rejoice and share your peace and love with all our neighbors this week.
- **We give our thanks for all the good gifts you continually give to us:** the assurance of your love day by day; the relief of your mercy when we recognize our own failings; hope to sustain us when things seem bleak; and peace that comes when we trust ourselves to your eternal keeping. These are the gifts that matter, O God, so for all these gifts and other blessings we recognize around us, we give you thanks.
- **Thank you for making this congregation part of the Body of Christ.** Keep us in union with him, our Cornerstone and Savior. Build and shape our worship, teaching, outreach, and fellowship on the witness of prophets, apostles, martyrs, saints, and faithful theologians.
- **We give thanks for all those who serve in the military and for all first responders.** Give them your peace, make them brave, wise, and just. Use them to bring safety and hope to dangerous places. Raise and heal them when they fall. Give steadfast hearts to their loved ones until they are reunited.

## In Our Prayers:

- **We lift up all places where your peace is not known and we lift up all people who do not know this same peace.** We ask your healing and reconciliation where there are barriers and dividing walls of hostility. We ask for this healing in our own lives and families where their might be divisions. We ask this for our churches where there are past wounds and divisions. We ask this for our nation that has many hostilities and divisions. And we pray this for the world that is so fractured. Come in like a wrecking ball to break all those walls down and bring true and everlasting peace to all these situations on our hearts!
- **Establish the Church as your living temple, built on the foundation of prophets and apostles, with Christ as its cornerstone.** Make its words precious and its actions holy. Use it to feed the world with the living bread of your holy Word.

- **Almighty God, who alone created the beauty and the bounty of our land, who cares and loves everyone—from the workers in the field to the owners of the field—be with your people in our region now in the midst of the fires.** Bring an end to the loss of lives and the loss of homes. Bring aid to the firefighters who, by serving others, serve you. Give them courage and strength to persevere, to find the ability in their bodies and souls to keep working for another day or hour or minute. Ease the winds that spread the flames and disperse the smoke that covers the sky. Bring hope to the displaced and the homeless. Keep alive inside their minds and hearts memories, the physical traces of which may be lost. Remind us that you are the promise of a new tomorrow. Bring rest and peace to those who have been lost, and let their souls find eternal life with you. Be a comfort and relief to the grieving.
- **O Lord, have compassion on all who are sick or stressed - heal and restore them, and give them confidence in you and meet the needs of others we know personally to be in need.** Let us hold hands with them and open hands to them in their time of need.

### Zoom Bible Study

#### He's Our Peace

Talk about when you were growing up, who you were told to “stay away from”; or who was seen as not part of your group

Part of the human condition is to instinctively think of people in terms of in-groups and out-groups. Who is part of our “in” group and who is in the “out” group for us? Who are the two groups in this passage? What do we learn about the differences between these groups from this passage? Are there other differences you are aware of?

Looking at verses 13-14, since these two groups were seen as drastically different, how revolutionary would Paul's ideas of reconciliation have seemed to his readers?

How would you have thought about this if you were one of the circumcised Jews? How would you have thought about this if you were one of the uncircumcised Gentiles?

In verse 22, Paul notes that we are “dwelling place for God” as we are being built together. How might we demonstrate this way of living in our churches and toward our communities?

## **Next Week-A Sending Blessing Over the Cropps**


