## WHAT TO EXPECT

- ◆ **Masks are optional for fully vaccinated people.** If you are not fully vaccinated we ask that you still wear your mask in accordance with local and national guidelines.
- ◆ **The double doors in the lower lot will be our only access point.**
- ◆ **There will be no sharing of the peace before service or receiving line after church to maximize social distancing.**
- ◆ **Please do not attend church or other church activities if you have a respiratory illness or feel like you are coming down with one for at least 14 days after your full recovery.** Family members should not attend either.
- ◆ **Offering collection: We will not be passing the collection plate during the offertory.** Please either drop your offering in the collection plates by the door or give online. Alternatively, you may mail a check to the church office.
- ◆ **Communion will be coming in prepackaged hosts and cups, of both wine and grape juice. We are planning on having communion only 2 times a month (1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays.)** Pastor will consecrate the communion elements during the service and we will commune together in the service at the designated time for communion. There will be a receptacle at the door for disposing the supplies upon leaving the sanctuary.
- ◆ **We will no longer be doing a temperature check at church, but do ask you to self monitor your temperature at home before coming to church.**

### In Our Prayers:

- **O Lord of truth in love, whose message to us has always been that our relationship to you is inextricably related to how we treat our sisters and brothers, bend low your spirit this day and touch us with your power.** Wean us from our tendency to nurture perceived slights and to put hot coals to our anger. - **You fed Elijah in the wilderness, and he journeyed forty days in the strength of that food.** Grant the bread of health and salvation to all who dwell in the wilderness of suffering. Strengthen them in their pilgrimage. Surround them with compassion and encouragement. Keep them steadfast in faith and strong in hope.

### Weekly Personal Study Guide

#### Speaking Truth

Read Ephesians 4:15-16, 25-5:2. What does it mean to speak the truth in love? What happens if you disconnect the two? Why are both critically important, not only for our faith lives, but the way we interact with others?

Looking at verse 25 think about this question. In the age of information, misinformation, and disinformation, what might Paul be advising us today as those who put away falsehoods?

How easy or hard is it for you to share a difficult or hard truth to someone else? Why is that the case for you?

Of the admonitions that Paul gives in verses 26-32, which do you find to be the hardest? Why is that the case for you?

How might all of these contribute to a community of believers that imitates God?

How might the church be thought of differently by the community around the church if we were intentional about having the kind of community with attributes described in this passage?

What might it look like for you to live more consciously of being an imitator of God?
