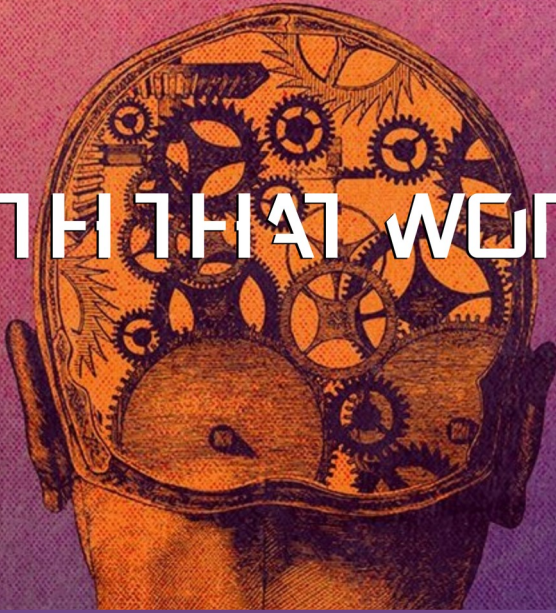

WHAT TO EXPECT

- ◆ **Masks are required even for fully vaccinated people.**
- ◆ **The double doors in the lower lot will be our only access point.**
- ◆ **There will be no sharing of the peace before service or receiving line after church to maximize social distancing.**
- ◆ **Please do not attend church or other church activities if you have a respiratory illness or feel like you are coming down with one for at least 14 days after your full recovery.** Family members should not attend either.
- ◆ **Offering collection: We will not be passing the collection plate during the offertory.** Please either drop your offering in the collection plates by the door or give online. Alternatively, you may mail a check to the church office.
- ◆ **Communion will be coming in prepackaged hosts and cups, of both wine and grape juice. We are planning on having communion only 2 times a month (1st and 3rd Sundays.)** Pastor will consecrate the communion elements during the service and we will commune together in the service at the designated time for communion. There will be a receptacle at the door for disposing the supplies upon leaving the sanctuary.
- ◆ **We will no longer be doing a temperature check at church, but do ask you to self monitor your temperature at home before coming to church.**

SERMON NOTES

Root of Conflict—James 3:13-4:3, 7-8a

PRAYERS & PRAISES

Praise God:

- **We praise you for your gift of peace and how you so it in our lives every single day.** We give thanks for you being the ultimate peacemakers and we give thanks for all peacemakers who sow in your name. As we dwell in your peace, make all of us bold peacemakers. Give us strength to go into situations where there is conflict, that your peace may be sown in them.
- **We praise you for the gifts of technology that are joining the communion of saints together in this time and which also has allowed us to hear the message from Pastor Matt this morning.** We also pray for travel safety for he and Melina as they travel home on Tuesday.
- **We also give thanks for the gift of marriage in our congregation!** We give thanks for the blessings of marriage and love you have given to Jerry and Robin Thomas over all their years of being together. Continue to bless and keep them in your love and care in you and for one another!
- **We give you thanks for those who work for peace and mercy in a world divided by bitter conflicts, and for those who keep peace and lead negotiations in international disputes.** Give them courage and perseverance. Weekly Personal Study Guide

Root of Conflict

Take some time to think through what your understanding of peace is.

Read James 3:13-4:3, 7-8a. What is the root cause of fights and quarrels? What does James say is the solution?

Reading this passage what do you learn about humility and submission, how can these attributes help quell conflict? What does humbling yourself before the Lord look like in your life? What actions, practices, or habits would help us submit to God's ways and draw us nearer to God?

Looking at verse 17, what are the characteristics of the wisdom from above? How do these things help in the midst of conflict? How do they differ from what worldly wisdom tells us?

Reading verse 18, what are we called to be sowing? What does James say is the result of sowing peace? How might Pastor Matt's example of Melina's garden stick with you in times of conflicted? What are ways you feel like you can sow peace this week?

How might you break an roots of conflict you are stuck in? What might God be calling you to do as a response to this passage?

Stewardship Thoughts—James 3:18

“Peacemakers who sow in peace reap a harvest of righteousness.”

It is the peacemaker who sows the seeds of peace, and that isn't an easy job. You have to work hard to cultivate peace. Do fruit and grain grow up by themselves and take care of themselves? Do they produce an abundant harvest all by themselves? No! Ask any farmer! There is a lot of work involved. There's the cultivation of the ground, adding fertilizer, sowing the seeds or planting seedlings, watering, weeding or spraying weeds, pruning, waiting, hoping, praying. Just because you're a Christian doesn't mean you automatically get along with others and never have conflicts. As individuals, and as churches, we need to work hard to cultivate peace with one another, listen to one another, express appreciation for one another, show kindness to one another, and settle arguments peaceably.
