



10:00 am– Worship Service

WHAT TO EXPECT

- ◆ Masks are required, regardless of vaccination status, for everyone over five years of age in public indoor settings. So, for now, we will all need to mask up for Sunday Services, and other group meetings at RLC.
- ◆ The double doors in the lower lot will be our only access point.
- ◆ There will be no sharing of the peace before service or receiving line after church to maximize social distancing.
- ◆ Please do not attend church or other church activities if you have a respiratory illness or feel like you are coming down with one for at least 14 days after your full recovery. Family members should not attend either.
- ◆ Offering collection: We will not be passing the collection plate during the offertory. Please either drop your offering in the collection plates by the door or give online. Alternatively, you may mail a check to the church office.
- ◆ Communion will be coming in prepackaged hosts and cups, of both wine and grape juice. We are planning on having communion only 2 times a month (1st and 3rd Sundays.) Pastor will consecrate the communion elements during the service and we will commune together in the service at the designated time for communion. There will be a receptacle at the door for disposing the supplies upon leaving the sanctuary.
- ◆ We will no longer be doing a temperature check at church, but do ask you to self monitor your temperature at home before coming to church.

Making Distinctions—James 2:1-10, 14-17

PRAYERS & PRAISES

Praise God;

- **We celebrate your love and how you make no distinctions in who you want your love shared with!** As you have first love us may we go forth and love everyone else making no distinctions in whom we share your love with! We also thank you for your compassion on us and on all people. Lead us to show the same compassion to others, whatever their background. Use us and our gifts for your service.
 - **We give you thanks and praise for the gift of life in all its stages.** We ask your blessings and joy on everyone who celebrates birthdays this month of September. May you bless their special days with joy and celebration and may you bless their years with your hope and steadfast love!
 - **O Lord of the Sabbath we thank you that you give us rest from our labors.** We pray that as we observe this Labor Day weekend that you would allow us to be still and rest in you today on the Sabbath and tomorrow. We also give thanks for the ability to travel on this long weekend and pray for travel safety for all those who are away. Finally, we give thanks for all those laborers who work hard to keep all our lives functioning smoothly. Give them your rest and let us show your care to them!

In Our Prayers:

- **We pray for all those who have not found rest this summer:** for those whose work is stressful, exhausting, or unappreciated; for those whose livelihoods remain uncertain, because of the pandemic or through disasters caused by heat, fire, or storm. We pray for all those who join efforts to relieve suffering of any kind. May each one find courage to face tomorrow in your company.

What is the distinction between being saved by works and what James is articulating?

What might God be calling you to do as a response to this passage?

“For if a man wearing a gold ring and fine clothing comes into your assembly, and a poor man in shabby clothing also comes in ...” God shows no partiality. This is why both the Old and New Testaments talk about proportional giving – that is giving a proportion of our income to the Lord's work.
